- Salix alba 'Vitellina', Golden Willow** 30-40' Zone 2
Large yellow stemmed willow that is extremely fast growing and tough. Use in moist naturalizing situations.

Large, fast growing native willow. Medium green, peach leaf like foliage and lighter colored stems.

Hardier substitute for S. purpurea 'Nana', but significantly faster growing and a larger mature size. Not as fine in texture as Salix purpurea 'Nana', leaves are larger and stems less numerous.

Spiraea x arguta compacta, Dwarf Garland Spirea 2-3'

Zone 4

Very small, delicate, light green foliage and thin, slender twigs make this an attractive, fine textured plant. Small single white flowers (on old wood) early in spring add to the beauty of this Spirea. Facer plant, small shrub for massing. Larger growing Spiraea x cineria 'Grefsheim', is similar.

Pink flowering above the foliage during early summer on new wood. Clean summer foliage and deep maroon fall color create multi-season interest. Useful as a facer plant or massed. Hardier than Spiraea 'Anthony Waterer'.

Zone 4

An attractive accent plant with golden-copper spring foliage, pink flowering in summer, fall color rich copper-orange. A useful compact facer or accent plant. Foliage not as bright yellow as Goldmound.

***Spiraea x bumalda* 'Gumball', Gumball Spirea 2'**

Zone 3

Light green foliage and a compact roundish form distinguish this from *Spiraea* 'Froebelii'. Gumball doesn't lay open the way 'Froebelii' does, so it looks neater in the landscape longer throughout the year. Dense, low maintenance plant, useful in facer planting.

Zone 4

Abundant white flowers borne in early spring on old wood, make this an interesting addition to the landscape. Light, gray-green foliage on cascading branches. Use in massing. More vigorous but similar to *Spiraea x arguta compacta*.

***Spiraea douglasii*, Pink Spirea 2-4'**

Zone 3

Native, low growing deciduous shrub with pink flowers that fade quickly in the summer. Irregular habit, best used when massed in landscape. One of the most adaptable native shrubs we grow.

***Syringa x hyacinthiflora* 'Assessippi', Assessippi Lilac** 10-12' Zone 2

Early flowering, fragrant, pale lavender flower color. Introduced from Canada. Use in large areas.

Hardy. Excellent for massing or hedging. More vigorous and adaptable in our climate than its close cousin *Syringa meyeri* 'Palibin'.

Coarse, upright growing, late lilac. Purplish-lavender flowers after Common Lilac. The Preston Lilacs are later flowering than the French Hybrid types but are more adaptable and quicker to establish than all other types of lilacs. We highly recommend these selections. Use in shrub borders.
