## Pears

Requires a pollinator for fruit production.

***Pyrus* 'Gourmet', Semi-Dwarf Gourmet Fruiting Pear (self-sterile)** 10-15' Zone 4

This variety is winter hardy with yellow fruit that is sweet and juicy to eat. A good medium-sized tree. Not a good pollinator. Flowers in early May.

This allows excess water to drain away from the tree and is especially useful where turf watering continues late into the fall. Mountain Ash, in particular, can benefit from this practice.
